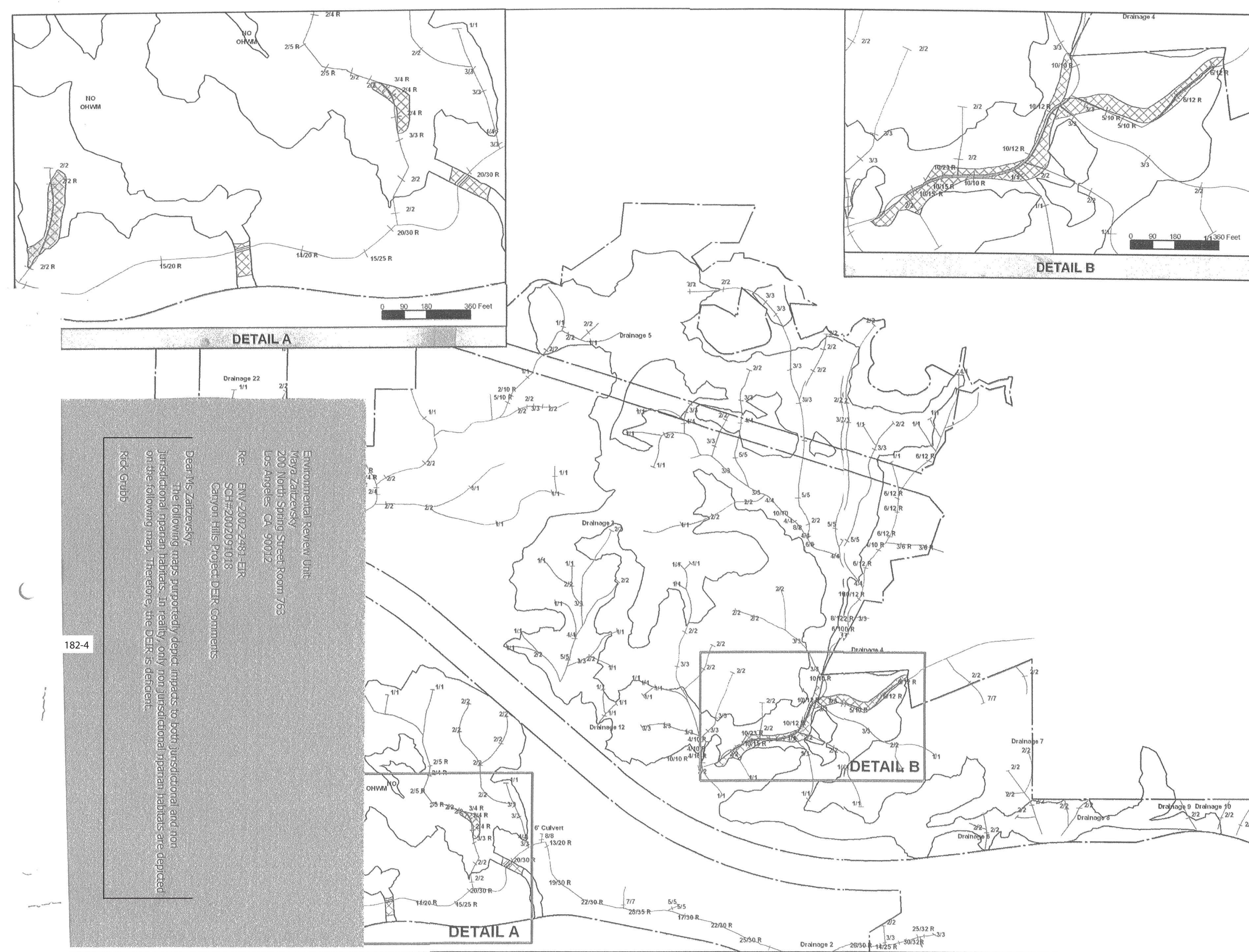
### Impact to Jurisdictional Riparian Habitats

-  Southern Mixed Riparian\* (.68 Acres)
-  S.C. Live Oak Riparian Forest\* (.04 Acres)
-  Southern Willow Scrub\* (.02 Acres)

### Impact to Non-Jurisdictional Riparian Habitats

-  Southern Mixed Riparian (1.96 Acres)
-  S.C. Live Oak Riparian Forest (.55 Acres)
-  Southern Willow Scrub (.29 Acres)

\* The width of jurisdictional riparian habitat impact for Southern Willow Scrub and Southern Coast Live Oak Riparian communities ranges from 2 to 5 feet. These widths are difficult to discern on this map. For these two communities, the reader should refer to the "R" width dimensions on the map and explained in the legend.
