In all instances, however, equal time is allowed for presentation of pros and cons of matters to be acted upon. Every person wishing to address the commission in person must complete a speaker's request form and submit it to the Commission staff.

Should technical difficulties occur or persist, the in-person meeting shall continue to be conducted. **Applicants, appellants and/or Representatives are required to attend the meeting in person.**

Written submissions, which are optional, may be submitted prior to, or at, the meeting. These are governed by the South Valley Area Planning Commission Rules and Operating Procedures posted online at <https://planning.lacity.org>. However, please see submission guidelines below which have been modified to accommodate the hybrid meeting format.

Initial Submissions, not limited as to volume, must be received by the Commission Executive Assistant no later than by 4:00 p.m. on the Monday prior to the week of the Commission meeting. Materials are to be emailed to apcsouthla@lacity.org. **Secondary Submissions** in response to a Staff Recommendation Report or additional comments must be received electronically no later than 48-hours before the Commission meeting. Submissions shall not exceed ten (10) pages, including exhibits, and must be submitted electronically to apcsouthla@lacity.org. Photographs do not count toward the page limitation. **Day of Hearing Submissions** within 24 hours of the meeting, up to and including the day of the meeting are limited to 2 pages plus accompanying photographs. Day of Hearing Submissions are to be submitted electronically to apcsouthla@lacity.org and 12 hard copies must be submitted at the in-person meeting. Submissions that do not comply with these rules will be stamped "**File Copy. Non-Complying Submission.**" Non-complying submissions will be placed into the official case file, but they will not be delivered to or considered by the Commission and will not be included in the official administrative record for the item at issue.

The Commission may RECONSIDER and alter its action taken on items listed herein at any time during this meeting or during the next regular meeting, in accordance with the Commission Rules and Operating Procedures and provided that the Commission retains jurisdiction over the case. If a Commission meeting is canceled or adjourned due to lack of quorum, all remaining agenda items shall be continued to the next regular meeting or beyond as long as the continuance is within the legal time limits of the case or cases.

There may be other time limits which also affect your ability to seek judicial review.

PUBLIC HEARING – Completed April 15, 2026

PROJECT SITE: 5800 – 5814 South Broadway

PROPOSED PROJECT:

Demolition of an existing 200 square-foot masonry building and the construction, use, and maintenance of a new drive-through fast-food establishment (Starbucks). The new 19-foot, one-story building will have a total floor area of 1,220 square-feet with a 0.9:1 Floor Area Ratio (FAR) and will provide five parking stalls. The Project proposes a drive-through service with a walk-up order and pick-up window. The proposed hours of operation will be 24 hours daily. No protected trees will be removed from the subject site or the public right-of-way, and ten new trees will be provided.

REQUESTED ACTIONS:

1. Pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Article 19, Section 15303 (Class 3), an exemption from CEQA and there is no substantial evidence demonstrating that an exception to a categorical exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Section 15300.2 applies;
2. Pursuant to Chapter 1 Section 12.24 W.17 and Chapter 1A Section 13B.2.2. of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), a Class 2 Conditional Use Permit to allow a drive-through fast-food establishment on a site adjoining a residential zone;
3. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Section 13.14 G.3 and LAMC Chapter 1A Section 13B.4.5, a Project Exception from the Southeast Los Angeles Community Implementation Overlay (CPIO) and Slauson Corridor Transit Neighborhood Plan (Slauson TNP) to permit:
 - a. A drive-through establishment in the Slauson TOD High (SG) Subarea, as otherwise prohibited by CPIO Section VI-2 A.1(a);
 - b. A building height of one story in lieu of two stories, as otherwise required by CPIO Section VI-3 A.2(i); and
 - c. Nine percent Lot Coverage in lieu of 30 percent, as otherwise required by CPIO Section VI-3 D.1(c)(i).

Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TTY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ..." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.
