Every person wishing to address the commission in person must complete a speaker's request form and submit it to the Commission staff.

If staff is unable to establish a strong remote connection the in-person meeting shall continue to be conducted. **Applicants, Appellants, and/or Representatives are required to attend the meeting in person.**

Written submissions, which are optional, may be submitted prior to, or at, the meeting. These submissions are governed by the North Valley Area Planning Commission Rules and Operating Procedures posted online at <https://planning.lacity.org/commissioners>.

Initial Submissions, not limited as to volume, must be received by the Commission Executive Assistant no later than by 4:00 p.m. on the Monday prior to the week of the Commission meeting. **Secondary Submissions**, limited to ten (10) pages, must be received no later than 48 hours before the Commission meeting. **Day of Hearing Submissions**, limited to two (2) pages, are received within 48 hours of the meeting. All submissions should be made electronically to apcnorthvalley@lacity.org. Photographs do not count toward page limits. Submissions can be made until the Chair closes public comment on the agenda item. Submissions that do not comply with these rules will be stamped "**File Copy. Non-Complying Submission.**" Non-complying submissions will be placed into the official case file, but they will not be delivered to or considered by the Commission and will not be included in the official administrative record for the item at issue.

The Commission may RECONSIDER and alter its action taken on items listed herein at any time during this meeting or during the next regular meeting, in accordance with the Commission Rules and Operating Procedures and provided that the Commission retains jurisdiction over the case.

If a Commission meeting is canceled or adjourned due to lack of quorum, all remaining agenda items shall be continued to the next regular meeting or beyond as long as the continuance is within the legal time limits of the case or cases.

There may be other time limits which also affect your ability to seek judicial review.

PROJECT SITE: 9236 North Burnet Avenue

The Applicant is requesting that this matter be continued to a date certain of August 20, 2026.

PROPOSED PROJECT:

Demolition of an existing single-family residence for the construction of four two-story multifamily residential duplexes with attached two-car garages, one garage per dwelling unit on a 22,869.8 gross square foot lot. The housing development will consist of eight dwelling units and 16 parking spaces. The units will range from 1,370 square feet to 1,534 square feet and have a maximum height of 30 feet, six inches.

REQUESTED ACTIONS:

1. Pursuant to California Public Resource Code Section 21080.66 (AB 130), a Statutory Exemption from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA);
2. Pursuant to Chapter 1A Section 13B.1.4.I and Chapter 1 Section 12.32 Q of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), a Vesting Zone Change from the RA-1 (Residential Suburban Zone) to (Q)(T)RD3-1 (Restricted Density Multiple Dwelling Zone); and
3. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1A Section 13B.5.2 and Chapter 1 Section 12.28 A, an Adjustment to permit a less than 20 percent reduction in minimum lot area per dwelling unit or guest room for a total of eight-units in lieu of the otherwise seven-units that would be permitted under the proposed RD3 Zone pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.09.1 B.4.

PROJECT SITE: 9247 North Wakefield Avenue

PROPOSED PROJECT:

Demolition of an existing single-family dwelling for the subdivision of one 24,008 gross square foot lot into eight small lots and for the construction of eight dwelling units, one on each lot. Each dwelling unit will have an attached garage with two parking spaces and there will be two guest parking spaces for the entire site. The eight dwelling units will each be two stories with a maximum height of 27 feet, six inches.

Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. territories for local and/or long-distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TTY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Do not hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ..." When you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.
