Every person wishing to address the commission in person must complete a speaker's request form and submit it to the Commission staff.

Written submissions, which are optional, may be submitted prior to, or at, the meeting. These submissions are governed by the West Los Angeles Area Planning Commission Rules and Operating Procedures posted online at <https://planning.lacity.org/commissioners>. **Initial Submissions**, not limited as to volume, must be received by the Commission Executive Assistant no later than by 4:00 p.m. on the Monday prior to the week of the Commission meeting. **Secondary Submissions**, limited to ten (10) pages, must be received no later than 48 hours before the Commission meeting. **Day of Hearing Submissions**, limited to two (2) pages, are received within 48 hours of the meeting. If the submission is made on the same day as the meeting, it is recommended that ten (10) hard copies of the submissions be brought to the meeting for distribution to Commissioners. All submissions should be made electronically to apcwestla@lacity.org. Photographs do not count toward page limits. Submissions can be made until the Chair closes public comment on the agenda item. Submissions that do not comply with these rules will be stamped **"File Copy. Non-Complying Submission."** Non-complying submissions will be placed into the official case file, but they will not be delivered to or considered by the Commission and will not be included in the official administrative record for the item at issue.

The Commission may RECONSIDER and alter its action taken on items listed herein at any time during this meeting or during the next regular meeting, in accordance with the Commission Rules and Operating Procedures and provided that the Commission retains jurisdiction over the case.

If a Commission meeting is canceled or adjourned due to lack of quorum, all remaining agenda items shall be continued to the next regular meeting or beyond as long as the continuance is within the legal time limits of the case or cases.

PROJECT SITE: 5000, 5927, 5298 and 5300 South Beethoven Street

PROPOSED PROJECT:

A Private Street to provide legal frontage and street access for the parcels at 5000 South Beethoven Street in conjunction with the construction, use, and maintenance of a new private access bridge over Centinela Creek, connecting the parcels to the existing public roadway system via Beethoven Street.

APPEAL:

An appeal of the April 24, 2026, Advisory Agency's Determination which:

1. Found, based on the independent judgment of the decision-maker, after consideration of the whole of the administrative record, the project was assessed in Mitigated Negative Declaration No. MND-97-0348-ZC-GPA-HD-SPR adopted on September 9, 1998; and pursuant to CEQA Guidelines 15162 and 15164, as supported by the addendum No. ENV-2023-6735-MND-REC1 dated October 2025, no major revisions are required to the Mitigated Negative Declaration; and no subsequent EIR or negative declaration is required for approval of the project;
2. Approved, pursuant to Chapter 1 Article 8 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code, a Private Street approval to provide a legal frontage and street access for the parcels at 5000 South Beethoven Street in the Palms – Mar Vista – Del Rey Community Plan, as shown on the map stamp-dated December 9, 2025; and
3. Adopted the Conditions of Approval and Findings.

PUBLIC HEARING – Completed June 15, 2026

PROJECT SITE: 305 East Rose Avenue and 254 South Hampton Drive

PROPOSED PROJECT:

Change of use of an existing 5,765 square-foot two-story church to a 5,765 square-foot private club including a commercial kitchen, co-working space and a lounge, providing 161 seats and 20 bicycle parking spaces; the project also includes new hardscape and minor façade improvements.

REQUESTED ACTIONS:

1. Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, an Exemption from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301, 15303 and 15331, and that there is no substantial evidence demonstrating that an exception to the Categorical Exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 applies;
2. Pursuant to Chapter 1A Section 13B.4.5, of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), a Specific Plan Exception to allow zero parking spaces in lieu of the required 77 spaces as otherwise required by Section 13D of the Venice Coastal Zone Specific Plan;
3. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.24 W.35 and Chapter 1A Section 13.B.2.2, a Class 2 Conditional Use Permit for the establishment of a private club within the RD1.5-1 Zone;

4. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1A Section 13B.4.2, a Project Permit Compliance Review for a project within the Oakwood Subarea of the Venice Coastal Zone Specific Plan; and
5. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1A Section 13B.9.1, a Coastal Development Permit for a Development within the Single Permit Jurisdiction of the California Coastal Zone.

Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. territories for local and/or long-distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TIY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service.

Do not hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ..." When you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.
