**PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED**

**PROJECT SITE:** 6023 West Rodgerton Drive

**PROPOSED PROJECT:**

Construction of a three-story single-family dwelling with a Residential Floor Area of 3,089 square-feet, on a 12,066 square foot lot. The dwelling will have a height of 43'-6". Five parking spaces will be provided. Three retaining walls are proposed, with a maximum height of 10 feet. Regarding grading, the Project proposes 1,450 cubic yards of cut, 570 cubic yards of fill, and 980 cubic yards of export in total. The Project does not propose the removal of any trees, and there are no protected trees or shrubs on-site.

**REQUESTED ACTIONS:**

1. Pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Section 15303, Class 3, an Exemption from CEQA, and that there is no substantial evidence demonstrating that an exception to a categorical exemption pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Section 15300.2 applies;
2. Pursuant to Chapter 1 Section 11.5.7 F. of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), a Specific Plan Exception to permit the location of retaining walls within three feet of the front lot line, as otherwise prohibited per Section 7.B.1 of the Hollywoodland Specific Plan;
3. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.28, a Zoning Administrator's Adjustment to permit retaining walls with a maximum height of 10 feet located within the required front and side yards, in lieu of the three and one-half foot limitation in the front yard and the six foot limitation in the side yard per LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.22 C.20.(f).
4. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.24 X.26, a Zoning Administrator's Determination to permit three retaining walls with a maximum height of 10 feet, in lieu of the limitation of one retaining wall with a maximum height of 12 feet per LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.21 C.8.(a);
5. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.24 X.28, a Zoning Administrator's Determination to permit the construction of a new single-family dwelling fronting on a Substandard Hillside Limited Street without providing a 20-foot-wide continuous paved roadway from the driveway apron to the boundary of the Hillside Area as otherwise required per LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.21 C.10.(i)(3);
6. Pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Sections 11.5.7. C. and 16.50, and Section 9 of the Hollywoodland Specific Plan (Ordinance No. 168,121), a Project Permit Compliance Review and Design Review for the construction of a new single-family dwelling in the RE9-1-HCR Zone;

**PUBLIC HEARING REQUIRED**

**PROJECT SITE:** 2069 North Argyle Avenue

**PROPOSED PROJECT:**

The installation of a new unmanned wireless telecommunications facility on the rooftop of an existing 54-foot-tall, five-story apartment building. The Project includes the installation of new Fiber-Reinforced

Polymer (FRP) screen walls, nine panel antennas, 14 remote radio units (RRUs), one surge suppressor, one power plant cabinet, one data cabinet, one battery cabinet, one TELCO box, and one electrical panel on the rooftop. The Project also includes the installation of a new generator connector and an MTS disconnect switch at grade level, as well as a meter bank on the P3 level. The new FRP screen walls will be eight feet eight inches in height and will not extend above the existing 54-foot-tall apartment building.

**APPEAL:**

An appeal of the June 9, 2026 Zoning Administrator's Determination which:

1. Determined, based on the whole of the administrative record, that the Project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Section 15303, and Class 3 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures), and there is no substantial evidence demonstrating that any exceptions contained in Section 15300.2 of the CEQA Guidelines regarding location, cumulative impacts, significant effects or unusual circumstances, scenic highways, or hazardous waste sites, or historical resources applies;
2. Approved, pursuant to Chapter 1 Section 12.24 W.49 and Chapter 1A Section 13B.2.2, of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), a Conditional Use to permit the installation, use, and maintenance of a new unmanned Wireless Telecommunications Facility (WTF) on the rooftop of an existing residential building in the R3-1XL Zone, with a height of 54 feet in lieu of the height limit of 30 feet required by Height District No. 1 XL; and
3. Adopted the Conditions of Approval and Findings.

## **Telecommunication Relay Services**

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. territories for local and/or long distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TTY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Don't hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ..." when you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.
