Every person wishing to address the commission in person must complete a speaker's request form and submit it to the Commission staff.

Initial Submissions, not limited as to volume, must be received by the Commission Executive Assistant no later than by 4:00 p.m. on the Monday prior to the week of the Commission meeting. **Secondary Submissions**, limited to ten (10) pages, must be received no later than 48 hours before the Commission meeting. **Day of Hearing Submissions**, limited to two (2) pages, are received within 48 hours of the meeting. Submissions can be made until the Chair closes public comment on the agenda item. Submissions that do not comply with these rules will be stamped "**File Copy. Non-Complying Submission.**" Non-complying submissions will be placed into the official case file, but they will not be delivered to or considered by the Commission and will not be included in the official administrative record for the item at issue.

The Commission may RECONSIDER and alter its action taken on items listed herein at any time during this meeting or during the next regular meeting, in accordance with the Commission Rules and Operating Procedures and provided that the Commission retains jurisdiction over the case.

If a Commission meeting is canceled or adjourned due to lack of quorum, all remaining agenda items shall be continued to the next regular meeting or beyond as long as the continuance is within the legal time limits of the case or cases.

There may be other time limits which also affect your ability to seek judicial review.

PROJECT SITE: 21126 and 21128 West Chatsworth Street

PROPOSED PROJECT:

The subdivision of one parcel into four parcels on a 78,026.5 gross square foot lot in the RA-1 Zone. There is an existing single-family dwelling proposed for demolition as a part of the Project. No grading and no construction are proposed. There are 43 trees on-site, three of which are Los Angeles Native Protected Trees. 15 trees are proposed for removal, none of which are Protected Trees.

PROJECT SITE: 7921 West Deniville Road

PROPOSED PROJECT:

The construction, use and maintenance of a new 1,869 square-foot two-story single-family dwelling with a 369 square-foot attached garage.

APPEAL:

An appeal of the July 1, 2026 Zoning Administrator's determination which:

1. Determined, based on the whole of the administrative record, that the Project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15303, Class 3, and that there is no substantial evidence demonstrating that any exceptions contained in Section 15300.2 of the State CEQA Guidelines regarding location, cumulative impacts, significant effects or unusual circumstances, scenic highways, or hazardous waste sites or historical resources applies;
2. Denied, pursuant to Chapter 1 Section 12.24 X.28(a)(7)(i) of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC), a Zoning Administrator's Determination to permit the construction of a new single-family dwelling on a

lot fronting a Substandard Hillside Limited Street without providing a 20-foot wide adjacent minimum roadway as required by LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.21 C.10(i)(2);

3. Approved, pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.24 X.28(a)(7)(ii), a Zoning Administrator's Determination to permit the construction of a new single-family dwelling on a lot that does not have a vehicular access route from a street improved with a minimum 20-foot-wide continuous paved roadway from the driveway apron to the boundary of the Hillside Area as required by LAMC Chapter 1 Section 12.21 C.10(i)(3);
4. Approved, pursuant to LAMC Chapter 1 Section 11.5.7.C, a Project Permit Compliance review for the construction of a new 1,869 square-foot, two-story single-family dwelling with an attached 369 square-foot garage in the San Gabriel/ Verdugo Mountains Scenic Preservation Specific Plan; and

Telecommunication Relay Services

Telephone communication is one of the most important forms of communication in society today. Due to advancements in technology, telephone devices have evolved with new services and capabilities. Individuals who are deaf and hard of hearing, and individuals with a speech disability are following these trends and are rapidly migrating to more advanced telecommunications methods, both for peer-to-peer and third-party telecommunications relay service (TRS) communications.

Telecommunications Relay Service is a telephone service that allows persons with hearing or speech disabilities to place and receive telephone calls. TRS is available in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. territories for local and/or long-distance calls. TRS providers - generally telephone companies - are compensated for the costs of providing TRS from either a state or a federal fund. There is no cost to the TRS user.

What forms of TRS are available? There are several forms of TRS, depending on the particular needs of the user and the equipment available: TRS includes: Text to Voice TTY-Based TRS; Speech-to-Speech Relay Service; Shared Non-English Language Relay Service; Captioned Telephone Relay Service; Internet Protocol Relay Service; and Video Relay Service. Do not hang up! Some people hang up on TRS calls because they think the Communications Assistant (CA) is a telemarketer. If you hear, "Hello. This is the relay service ..." When you pick up the phone, please don't hang up! You are about to talk, through a TRS provider, to a person who is deaf, hard-of-hearing, or has a speech disability.
