Los Feliz Improvement Association (LFIA), the association for all residents of Los Feliz, is writing in support of the Hollywood Sikh Temple, 1966 N. Vermont Ave. in Los Feliz being designated a City of Los Angeles Historic-Cultural Monument.

The Sikh Temple has been part of the fabric and history of the Los Feliz community for more than 50 years. The Board of Directors of Hollywood Heritage, its Preservation Issues Committee, and its members thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on the proposed Historic Cultural Monument nomination for The Complex **6464-6480 W. Santa Monica Boulevard; 1048-1060 N. Wilcox Avenue**

The primary record for reviewing resources within the former Hollywood CRA is the Historic Resources Survey of the Hollywood Redevelopment Area, completed by Historic Resources Group Inc. in 2019. The property located at **6464-6480 W. Santa Monica Boulevard** is a Spanish Colonial Revival Commercial Building constructed in 1928. The survey states that it is an "excellent and rare example of early commercial development located along a former streetcar line in Hollywood; most examples from this period do not retain integrity." It was given a status code of 3S;3CS;5S3

Hollywood Heritage has reviewed the relevant documents and determined the subject property as individually eligible for listing under the national, state, and local designation programs as an excellent example of streetcar-related commercial development in Hollywood. The building is in good condition and retains a high degree of integrity and community support. We fully support the nomination and urge the commission to declare the property a Historic-Cultural Monument.
