Dear Mr. Milofski,

As the City Councilmember for the Second District, I am writing to express our support for the proposed designation of 11222 Dilling Street in Studio City ("The Brady Bunch House") as a Historic-Cultural Monument.

The property is an internationally recognized structure whose exterior appearance has become deeply embedded in the shared popular culture of the United States generally and Los Angeles in particular. Designation as a Historic-Cultural Monument is an appropriate and meaningful step to recognize and preserve the site's historic and cultural significance.

At the same time, we wish to clearly state for the record that our support for the Historic-Cultural Monument designation does not extend to, nor should it be construed as endorsement of, large-scale events, parties, short-term rentals, or other activities that generate large crowds or disrupt the surrounding residential neighborhood. We understand that the item before the Commission is limited to consideration of the HCM designation itself, and not the approval of any specific use, event program, or operational activity.

Should a museum-type use, public visitation program, or any other change in use be pursued following designation, it is our expectation that all applicable approvals be sought through the appropriate channels, including the Department of Building and Safety and the Department of City Planning, and that such proposals be subject to

full review in accordance with the Los Angeles Municipal Code and all applicable regulations.

Our support for the HCM nomination is grounded in the preservation of the site's historic and cultural value, while also recognizing the importance of maintaining neighborhood compatibility and respecting established land use processes.

Designating the Brady Bunch House as a Cultural Monument would show that cultural sites from the modern era deserve recognition and care. It would ensure that this iconic home remains a place where people of all ages can reflect on what connects us.

As a young person, I value spaces that help us understand our past while reminding us of what we can be at our best. I hope you will consider preserving the Brady Bunch House for future generations.
