Dear Ms. Gulley:

The Department of City Planning has received your letter dated April 12, 2016. You have requested a formal request for consultation and for the City to forward 1) the estimated cubic yards of soil disturbance for the project, and 2) any cultural resource reports or archaeological survey for or near the project property. This letter memorializes the start of the AB 52 tribal consultation process.

The proposed project would require approximately 60,000 cubic yards of ground disturbance. Meanwhile, the City is treating your request for any cultural resource reports or archaeological survey for or near the project property as a public records request and will respond separately in writing after staff has concluded its review of the City's public records.

At this time, it is unclear to the City whether there is substantial evidence supporting potential impacts to tribal cultural resources at this specific project site that would necessitate any specific mitigation measures. If you have additional information or evidence, we welcome you to request a meeting, and/or submit that information or evidence to the City.
