## PROJECT TITLE: CANYON HILLS PROJECT

The proposed project involves the Los Angeles Police Department's (LAPD's) Foothill Area, Reporting Districts (RD)'s 1694 and 1699. In a previous letter dated February 7, 2003, and addressed to Ms. Leah Dierkes, RD 1699 was omitted unintentionally. In this corrected correspondence I have enclosed only RD 1699 statistics for use in the final Environmental Impact Report.

The service boundaries for RD 1699 are as follows: the Foothill Freeway (210) to the north, the Los Angeles City boundary to the south and east, and the Wildwood Fire Road, and La Tuna Canyon Road to the west. All previous correspondence is correct in regards to RD 1694 and information on Foothill Area.

A project of this size would have a significant impact on police services in Foothill Area. The LAPD's Community Relations Section, Crime Prevention Unit (CPU) is available to advise you on crime prevention features appropriate to the design of the property involved in the project. The LAPD strongly recommends that developers contact CPU personnel to discuss these features.

Upon completion of the project, you are encouraged to provide the Foothill Area commanding officer with a diagram of each portion of the property. The diagram should include access routes and any additional information that might facilitate police response.
