BEAUTIFICATION CONCEPTS FOR ARGYLE AVENUE AND YUCCA STREET

Presently Argyle Avenue north of Hollywood Boulevard and Yucca Street west of Argyle Avenue in Hollywood are barren and uninviting. The underpass of the Hollywood Freeway on Argyle Avenue is downright foreboding; a no-persons' zone. The underpass presents a barrier to people living north of Franklin Avenue who might want to walk to Hollywood. A vacant triangular-shaped island of land on the northwest corner of Argyle Avenue and Yucca Street consumes a large space of plain asphalt and offers nothing to anyone, save a lonely DASH bus stop.


These streets serve as a gateway to Hollywood and should greet people as they enter. The vacant triangle of land offers an opportunity to become a centerpiece of this gateway, inviting people to Hollywood. Plans are being developed to landscape this triangle, but that would only be a minor improvement. This paper presents concepts to illustrate some of the potential that the island and the streets have to:

- · Create an inviting gateway to Hollywood
- Beautify the whole area
- · Improve retail opportunities for restaurants on Yucca Street
- Add some life to these streets
- Make an environment that invites people to walk or bicycle in the neighborhood, from neighborhoods north of Franklin, and to Hollywood Boulevard
- Connect to Hollywood Boulevard and Vine Street as the "Heart of Hollywood" plans become realized

The purpose of the is paper is only to stimulate a conversation and an effort to plan something better than what is there now. Nothing here is meant to be a final plan, but only to show possibilities. If the community likes the concept,

the next step would be to initiate a public outreach effort with a landscape architect who can develop construction drawings to build what community stakeholders want. Funding would be needed, but this project doesn't have to be expensive. And adjacent property owners may agree that a small investment in this project would be well worth it.

These concepts are shown by segment.




The Triangular-Shaped Island

Plans are presently being developed to landscape the existing island. That will make a nice improvement. However, there is much more unused land at the island that creates an opportunity to have a much larger area landscaped/ streetscaped into something special.

As shown in the aerial below a large painted out area is unused. This could expand the size of the island to that of the painted-out area. This would allow for more public space and beautification. Further, since traffic volumes on Yucca Street are low, the slip lane between the island and sidewalk could be closed as well, further expanding the area. Motorists turning westbound onto Yucca Street from Argyle Avenue southbound could make a right-turn at the intersection. With this large of a piece of public space, many interesting things could be added including, but not limited to:

- Landscaping
- · Street furniture with tables and chairs
- Decorative street lighting
- Statue (something reflecting Hollywood character Oscar trophy?)
- · Café, flower shop
- Designer bus stop
- Bicycle parking
- Hollywood gateway


Argyle Avenue and Yucca Street



Intersection of Argyle Avenue and Franklin Avenue

This intersection presently discourages people from walking across. The freeway onramps are wide and encourage motorists to speed. There is no pedestrian crossing on the west and north sides. People walking from Hollywood Dell to Hollywood need to cross this intersection. In order to cross, someone needs to cross Argyle further north at Vine Street/Dix Street then cross Argyle Avenue again if their destination is on the west side. The high-speed traffic makes this less than safe and inviting. Combined with the freeway underpass, likely few people are willing to walk here. This presents a barrier from the Dell and to locations along Franklin Avenue. This plan improves the intersection with:

- Continental crosswalks on all 4 legs
- Advance stop lines on all 4 legs, except at the freeway on ramp
- Islands to break up the crossings on the west leg and south leg
- Curb extensions on the northeast, northwest and southwest corners crossing Argyle Avenue
- Narrowing of the freeway on ramp (presently 31', 24' would be sufficient)
- · Add protected bike lanes on Argyle Avenue south of Franklin Avenue
- · This will require coordination with Caltrans

Hollywood Freeway Underpass

This underpass is dark, dirty and uninviting. This needs some real work, and some creative thinking. This paper won't present specific concepts. Just a few ideas. First, good lighting is needed. The protective buffer on the bike lanes could have landscape/ streetscape. The bridge support poles could host some art. The whole underpass might have colored lights. Other ideas could come from a public outreach process. A homeless encampment presently occupies a portion of the area under the freeway on the east side. Prior to executing any beautification, we need to find a decent place for these people to live.


Argyle Avenue Under the Freeway

- 4 lanes + left-turn lane
- Just south of Franklin Ave. 2 left-turn lanes north and westbound, 1 rightturn lane northbound
- Parking is permitted on the west side with no meters

Proposed Concept

- Maintain both northbound lanes
- Eliminate one lane southbound
- Add protected bike lanes in both directions with buffers
- Use the buffers to add some beautification. If there isn't sufficient light for plants, add hardscape? Public art?
- Anything done here will require coordination with Caltrans

- The protective buffers for the bike lanes can be beautified with trees. This is also an opportunity for placemaking that reflects the Hollywood theme. Oscar trophy, other?



- 4 metered parking spaces on the west side and 6 metered parking spaces on the east side

- · Add protected bike lanes in both directions
- The protective buffers for the bike lanes can be beautified with trees. This is also an opportunity for placemaking that reflects the Hollywood theme. Oscar statues, other?
- Add dispersed landscaped median islands where they won't interfere with driveways










