The LA Department of City Planning has once again demonstrated its inability to plan rationally. In spite of our being under a "Safer At Home" order due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the LA Department of City Planning has provided only the minimum comment period (April 16 - May 31st) for the proposed Hollywood Center Development (aka: Millennium Group).

The Department is well aware that Neighborhood Councils have consistently condemned the Millennium Group's egregious disregard of the well-being of the community-at-large. This latest Department's proposal smacks of collusion between the LA Department of City Planning and developers akin to Trump's maneuvering to suppress the vote (as seen in Wisconsin) and to favor corporate greed at the expense of the People.

The City's proposal is not only unfair, it is irrational. A far more rational approach is to extend the public comment period on the Draft Environmental Impact Report to a minimum of **90 days AFTER the City and State "Stay At Home" order has been lifted.**
