The proposed 3600 Wilshire Community Plan Project will be under the jurisdiction of the Olympic Community Police Station (OLYM Station), located at 1130 South Vermont Avenue, Los Angeles, CA 90006. Telephone Number (213) 382-9102.

The project site is approximately 1 mile and 8 minutes without any traffic from the Police Station in Reporting District (RD) 2033.

Olympic Geographic Area is approximately 6.2 square miles and consists of 54 RD's. The service boundaries of Olympic Area are as follows: Melrose Avenue, Beverly Boulevard to the North, Santa Monica Freeway to the South, Hoover Street, Normandie Avenue to the East, Arlington Avenue, Crenshaw Boulevard, Plymouth Boulevard, and Gower Street to the West.

It has approximately 235 sworn personnel and 14 civilian support staff assigned. It is a culturally diverse community with a population of approximately 200,000 people. The officer to resident ratio is 1 officer to 851 residents in Olympic Area. Additionally, there are special service teams available within the LAPD to service Olympic Area.

Olympic Station's emergency response system is directly linked to the Los Angeles Police Department Communications Division's Dispatch Centers. Communications Division has the responsibility to staff and answer, on a 24-hour basis, the telephones upon which calls for service are received. This includes 911 emergency calls (police, fire, and paramedic). Communication Division handles only police related calls for the City.

The average response time to emergency calls for service in Olympic Area during 2016 was 3.1 minutes. The average response time for non-emergency calls for service in Olympic Area during 2016 was 21.4 minutes.
