



AB 2011 LABOR COMPLIANCE FORM

NOTICE TO DEVELOPMENT PROPONENT

Assembly Bill 2011 of 2022 requires that a housing development proposed under the law satisfy the labor requirements of Government Code Section (GCS) 65912.130 and, for projects with 50 or more units, 65912.131. The development proponent must certify compliance with the local government. This form is used to satisfy these requirements.

I am the owner or developer, or authorized agent ("developer proponent") of the project identified above. I hereby certify, under the penalty of perjury, to the City of Los Angeles that the prevailing wage compliance requirements in Section 65912.130 of the Government Code will be met during the construction of the development project. Furthermore, I certify that the development project is either less than 50 units, or if 50 units or more, that each contractor of any tier who will employ construction craft employees or will let subcontracts for at least 1,000 hours shall satisfy the apprenticeship and health care requirements in subdivisions (b) and (c) of section 65912.131 of the Government Code. In addition, for projects with 50 units or more, I certify that while construction contracts on the development are being performed, monthly reports will be provided to the City (at the email Planning.AB2011laborcompliance@lacity.org) demonstrating compliance with the apprenticeship and health care requirements in subdivisions (b) and (c) of section 65912.131 of the Government Code. The reports shall be considered public records under the California Public Records Act (Division 10 (commencing with Section 7920.000) of Title 1), and shall be open to public inspection.
