

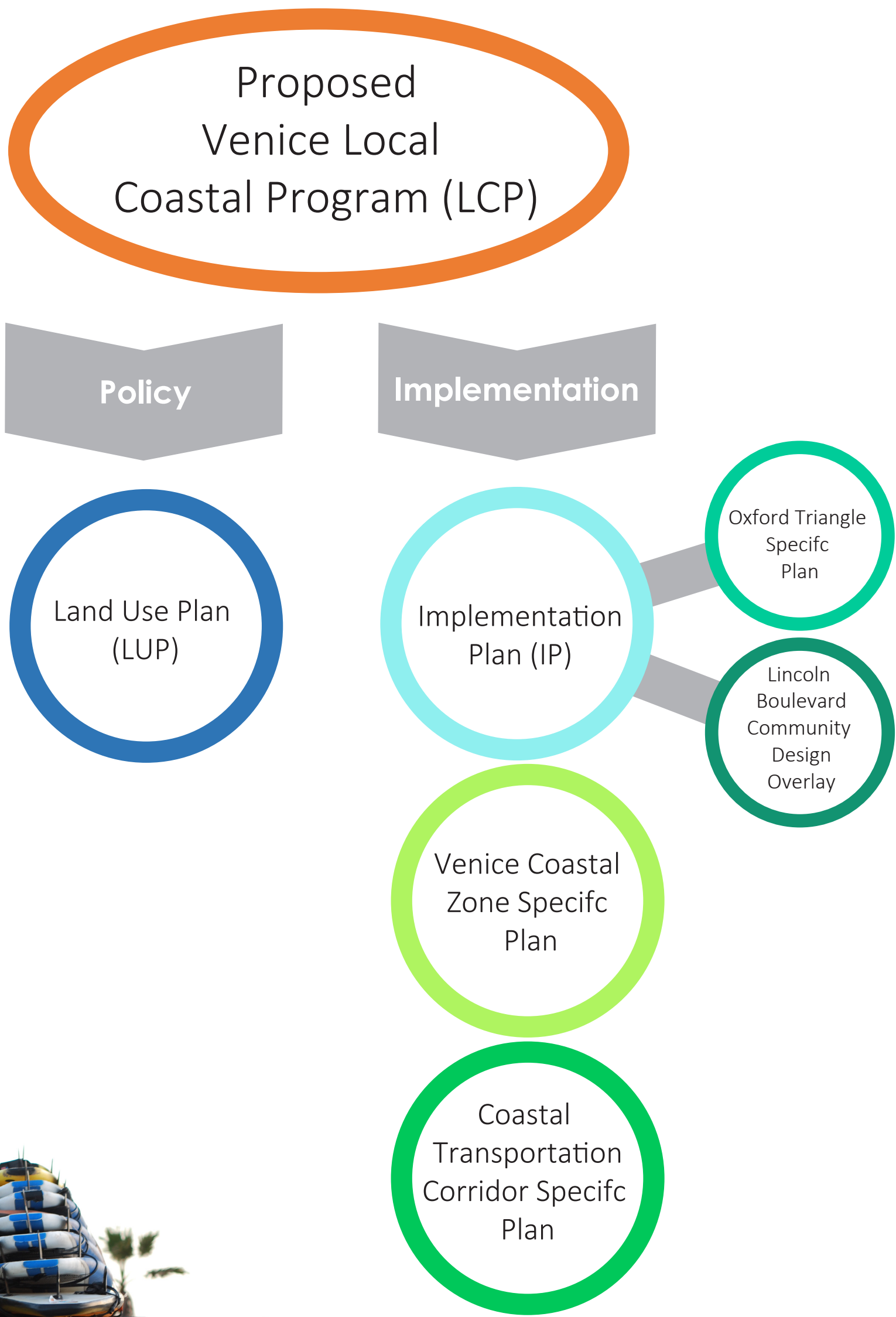
ABOUT LOCAL COASTAL PROGRAMS (LCP)

PURPOSE

- A Local Coastal Program (LCP) is a planning tool that:
- Guides development in the coastal zone
 - Protects natural and coastal resources
 - Maximizes public access to the shoreline
 - Addresses sea level rise and climate change

HOW THEY WORK

LCPs contain both policies (LUP) and regulations (LIP) for establishing the kind, location, and intensity of land and water use appropriate to portions of the California Coastal Zone.



VENICE LCP PLANNING PROCESS



The California Coastal Act mandates that all coastal communities have a Certified Local Coastal Program. The California Coastal Commission certifies Local Coastal Programs (LCPs) and administers them in partnership with coastal communities.

Manage development
to respond to coastal
hazards, reducing risk
to life and avoiding
substantial changes to
natural landforms

8. ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE HABITAT AREAS (ESHA) & OTHER NATURAL RESOURCES

Protect ESHA including
wetlands, riparian
areas, coastal prairies,
woodlands, forests,
and other natural
resources in the
coastal zone

9. WATER QUALITY

Protect and enhance
marine and coastal
water resources

10. PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE

Ensure that public
infrastructure be
designed, constructed
and maintained for
resilience



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
