# 2. What are the current desired standards of service (i.e. facility size, number of volumes, etc.) for the service population?

On February 8, 2007, The Board of Library Commissioners approved a new Branch Facilities Plan. This Plan includes Criteria for new Libraries, which recommends new size standards for the provision of LAPL facilities – 12,500 s.f. for a community with less than 45,000 population and 14,500 s.f. for a community with more than 45,000 population and up to 20,000 s.f. for a Regional branch. It also recommends that when a community reaches a population of 90,000, an additional branch library should be considered for the area.

Currently, the Felipe de Neve branch at 9,273 square feet does not meet the standard of 14,500 square feet for a service population in excess of 45,000 nor are there plans to develop a new branch library even though the community population has already exceeded a service population of over 90,000. Any increase in the residential/business population that is in close proximity to this branch has a direct impact on library services with increased demands for library staffing, materials, computers and information services. Therefore, mitigation measures are necessary in order to lessen the impact to these services to a level that is appropriate for a given service population in accordance to the February 8, 2007 Board of Library Commissioners approved Branch Facilities Plan.

The Los Angeles Public Library recommends a mitigation fee of \$200 per capita based upon the projected population of the development. The funds will be used for staff, books, computers and other library materials. It is recommended that the mitigation fees be paid by the developer.
