WHAT IS A COMMUNITY PLAN AND WHY DO WE NEED TO UPDATE IT?

The City of Los Angeles' General Plan Land Use Element is composed of 35 Community Plans, and it is important that they are up-to-date. Each Community Plan contains policies reflecting a future vision for neighborhoods and designates land for the range of uses needed, including jobs, housing, transportation, open space and amenities.

WHAT DOES THE PLAN DO?

The Community Plan serves the following role:

- Tells developers and homeowners what type of development will be permitted, and at what densities and intensities;
- Outlines strategies for how to accommodate anticipated growth; and
- Guides decision-making when there are projects proposed


THE BOYLE HEIGHTS COMMUNITY PLAN UPDATE

The Department of City Planning has organized several focus groups and workshops over the past several years to solicit input on the community's vision for their neighborhood. While prioritizing the needs of current residents, the plan provides guidance for the next 20 years by thoughtfully accommodating projected growth for future generations, providing strategies to encourage affordable housing development and retention throughout the plan area, protecting neighborhood character, and enhancing quality of life for existing residents. The updated plan includes goals and policies, as well as new zoning developed through the citywide re:code LA effort, to achieve the community's vision.
