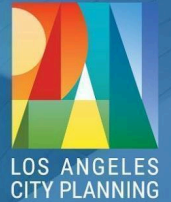

What to Expect

Thank you for your dedication to helping shape the Westside Community Plan Updates. Members of the Advisory Group serve as a community sounding board to provide feedback on draft materials shared by planning staff. Each member of the Advisory Group brings with them a unique perspective, set of experiences, and expertise. The Advisory Group is not a decision-making body and will assist planning staff in evaluating draft community plan update materials – such as Draft Refined General Plan Land Use (GPLU) maps, Draft New Zoning Regulations, and Draft Policy Documents. Please be ready to discuss, share ideas, and be open to listening to a range of viewpoints.

Ground Rules for Discussion:

- Be courteous and respectful to all members and staff
- Focus on problem solving, not just problem identifying
- Share information and perspectives
- Tackle issues and don't attack individuals
- Be present and fully engaged
- Turn off cellphones and background noise/distractions when speaking
- Share the mic - allow others to speak
- Have one conversation at a time

Curriculum Materials & Public Access

This curriculum provides a schedule for the 2024 WCPAG meetings. Planning staff will facilitate all the meetings. The Advisory Group is not a decision-making body and no votes or motions will take place. There will be a theme for each of the Advisory Group meetings, which will include presentations, discussion topics and feedback activities. All materials for the presentation will be posted on the website one to two weeks prior to each of the meetings. Meeting summaries and video recordings of the meeting will be posted on the planning website after each meeting.

Structure of Meetings

Meetings will consist of three parts: (1) presentations from planning staff on various topics and relevant materials, (2) large group report backs that will allow in-depth dialogue, and (3) group Q & A. In addition to these meetings, members will be tasked with providing targeted feedback on the previous released materials such as the 2024 Draft StoryMap Zoning Regulations.
