What is CEQA?


CEQA, or the California Environmental Quality Act, is a statute that requires state and local agencies to identify the potential significant environmental impacts of projects and land use plans and to avoid or mitigate those impacts, if feasible.

A Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) will be prepared to analyze the proposed land use changes and the potential significant environmental impacts related to implementation of the Proposed Community Plan Update. Where there is potential for a significant adverse effect, the report will identify mitigation measures that would either eliminate the impact or reduce the effect to a less-than-significant level, where possible. The Draft EIR will be provided to the community for review and comment prior to the adoption of the Proposed Plans.


